Tribal and Rural Youth: Inclusion and Opportunities

September 16-18, 2020

CONTEXT

The father of our nation, Mahatma Gandhi said that our Country's strength lies within its villages. Rural and tribal areas contribute significantly towards the overall growth and economic development of a country. A data states that among the 5.98 billion people(approximately) who live in this world, 3.4 billion people(approximately) live in villages/rural areas.

However, many issues still plague the villages and tribal areas of India such as poverty, water scarcity, malnourishment, lack of basic facilities, illiteracy, unemployment, anti-social elements etc. Since independence, disguised unemployment seemed to be a major threat in rural areas because of the evergrowing population. India is passing through the transition phase of young talent goldmine which should be appropriately nurtured, developed and added to the HR pool. Effective utilization of resources and availability of a skilled individual helps in ensuring that the developmental activities aren't compromised. For attaining gainful result, special devotion is required towards the strengthening of the skill development infrastructure.

Skill development is a huge challenge, not only for the government but also for the private sectors and educational institutions to rise up and specialize in nurturing youth employability and ensuring no mismatch between demand and supply. The highly educated youths do not want to turn back and work in farms and any related activities. It is important for this sector to be *atmanirbhar* as self-reliant India isn't possible without self-reliant villages.

The Government of India, has initiated two programs, Skill India and Make in India to create a framework for skill development and entrepreneurship activities in the country. Skill India's primary objective is to ensure a well-established infrastructure for skill development and to focus on creating skilled labour force by imparting professional skills and employment-oriented training. This needs to be further sustainably mainstreamed towards promoting the gender equality and social inclusion in rural and tribal areas.

It is in this backdrop, Centre for Agrarian Relations, Rural and Behavioural Studies, V.V. Giri National Labour Institute, Noida, Uttar Pradesh in collaboration with Centre for Study of Social Exclusion and Inclusive Policy Gandhi gram Rural Institute, Gandhigram, Tamil Nadu is organizaing three days National Workshop on, "Skill Development for Tribal and Rural Youth: Inclusion and Opportunities". This workshop is expected to provide an opportunity and a platform for Academicians; Researchers; Officials from PRIs; NGO & trade union representative; Skill Development Institutions to discuss the opportunities and challenges of tribal and rural youth's need of skill development in India with a focus on government policies and programs paving a way for their inclusion and well-being.

This workshop will be delivered in online mode. The workshop will primarily be interactive in nature with the provision of presentation through case studies; dissemination of documentaries; group work; assignments e.t.c.,

Faculty members of VVGNLI, GRI and Subject experts will be the primary resource persons.

PARTICIPATION LEVEL

Academicians; Researchers; Officials from PRIs; NGO & trade union representative; Skill Development Institutions are expected to apply for this programme. For the welfare of vulnerable and marginalized section of the society, we will appreciate if participants from reserved categories (SC/ST/OBC/EWS) are also nominated.

Participants should have working knowledge of Hindi/English Language. Further, as this is an online workshop, those enrolling in the programme should have access to internet and laptop/desktop /smart phone with audio-visual facilities.
